- Draw your own ladybirds. Draw a different amount of spots on each of their wings. Write addition and subtraction number sentences for each of your ladybirds.

For example:

$$3 + 4 = 7$$

$$4 + 3 = 7$$

$$7 - 3 = 4$$

$$7 - 4 = 3$$

## Geography

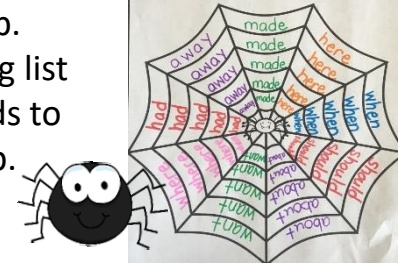
Listen to the following [song](#) about the seven continents:
