

## Maths


- Watch the videos about [2D shapes](#) and [3D shapes](#) and listen to the [shape song](#).

## History

## Computing

## English

  - Create a poster to show all the places you like to visit in your local area. Write about a visit to one of your favourite places.

- Write a description of the dragon.
- Draw pictures to show the main events in the story.
- Retell the story in your own words. Try using phrases such as: 'once upon a time', 'one day', suddenly' 'unfortunately' 'luckily' and 'in the end', to help you sequence the events in order.




