


Maths

Ask your child to think about their proudest achievements both inside and outside the classroom this year. Design and create an achievement medal. Why not have a ceremony and present the medal to your child?










Science





Get creative using lots paints, chalk or even use a your i-pad to draw.</p> 	<p>3D Shapes: Watch the following video: 3D shapes. Describe the tower by writing sentences in your workbook. E.g. There are ___ cuboids. You could also have a go at making shapes using lollypop sticks click here for instructions.</p> 	<p>Measure: Write sentences in your workbook using the words: longer, shorter, taller and equal to describe the following pictures.</p> 	<p>Measure: Write the length in cms.</p> 
<p>Problem of the day Create repeating patterns using different colours.</p> 	<p>Problem of the day How many 2D shapes can you find around your bedroom? Draw a picture of the shapes you find and label them.</p> 	<p>Problem of the day The bottom of the shape is hidden. What shape is it?</p> 	<p>Problem of the day Go on a hunt around your bedroom. Can you find an object shorter than your workbook? Can you find an object longer than your workbook?</p> 	<p>Problem of the day Go around your house and choose 5 objects. Put them in order from the shortest to the longest. If you have a ruler, measure them using centimeters (cm).</p> 


